Thanks go to Eric Mazzi for touring a group of us Wreckers and UBC infrastructure engineer, Doug Doyle, to various former water-flow monitoring sites on the UBC campus. Mr. Doyle has been charged with designing a stormwater management system for UBC's waterways as they plunge down our cliffs into the receiving waters of Wreck Beach. Now that South Campus is building out with an eventual 13 high rise towers, and new towers are being constructed and planned for the Campus at the Ponderosa Hub and the Orchard Gardens site, a comprehensive stormwater management plan (ISMP) becomes crucial. The WBPS has maintained to UBC for years, that they need a comprehensive stormwater management plan with stakeholders involved in the planning process from the beginning, not brought in to be informed of the plans made by someone else! When very few folks showed up at the Open House of July 6, it was due to their having lost faith in UBC really caring about or listening to other stakeholders in the surrounding communities, including the Wreck Beach one.

A number of recent studies shed new light on who should worry with a far longer list of associated traits than the blue eyes, freckles and history of sun exposure we've been hearing about for years and years. Darrell S. Rigel, MD, clinical professor of dermatology at New York University Medical Center, and a colleague examined factors common among 600 people (300 melanoma patients and 300 who did not have the disease),age and gender matched from age 21 to 80, to identify which were most often associated with melanoma. They came up with a list of 43 different factors, then conducted a multivariate analysis that ferreted out six characteristics that each independently predicted **These** melanoma. are particular order): 1. A history of blistering sunburns as a teenager. 2. Red or blonde hair. 3.
