




Check out the new fencing and signage at the Point Grey Scar which became necessary after a young man was killed in a slide on those unstable cliffs. Speaking of which the President's mansion sited above Wreck Trail #4 has massive lawns and we have been trying to get the University to put in a Zen sand "garden" there since 1981 instead so all that water doesn't flow out the perched aquifers (clay layers between the Quadra sands) above the Trail 4 beach, causing the massive slides like the one which killed the camper this past spring at the Point Grey Scar just to the West of the mansion's lawns . Now, the University, after internal talks with Metro Vancouver since January 2015, finally was urged by Mitch Sokalski, General Manager of all GVRD Parks, to They have now involve the WBPS. embarked on another series of clifferosion studies under the guise of erosion-control for buildings and towers they should never have built so close to the cliff's edge in the first place. They have hired Golder and Associates to do the \$100,000 study. They will be assessing what the risks are to UBC and what kinds of strategies UBC can use in investigation" "non-invasive determine what UBC "can do within its means," since they claim to have "no hidden agenda," Apparently they did studies in 2005, and 2010 and this is to follow up in 2015, but they admitted, it was triggered by the death in a landslide of the young man camped above the cliffs near the President's residence which refuses to stop watering its vast lawns. Thus, if you see men in vests, hard hats, and logger boots scaling our cliffs, remember not to kill the messenger. Both Steve and Judy were invited to this high-level meeting with west Area Parks new manager, Jeffrey Fitzpatrick and Mitch. Perhaps, if UBC realizes the rate of erosion has increased tremendously, they won't be tempted to erect a row of high rises on the old experimental gardens adjacent to (south of) Totem residences.

# End of an Era... WATERMELON RETIRES

Wreck Beach icon Watermelon is retiring her famous melons. Since starting out selling watermelons Vancouver's on infamous nude beach, the woman born Mary Jean Dunsdon has become one of city's most sought-after media personalities. This month, announcing her decision to no longer work on the beach. "It's been a glorious 22 years," Watermelon says. "I loved that beach from the moment I laid bum cheeks on it. Wreck Beach has allowed me to pursue happiness and independence in a way no one thought possible. However, it is time for me to pass the baton and begin a new chapter." Today, she has her own pot-themed cooking show and is the proprietor of The Licorice Parlour, an East Vancouver candy store. In her role as a glamorous spokesperson, she has been publications featured in local international magazines.

Watermelon started out on Wreck Beach selling T-shirts for Paddy White, an 80year-old Irish bootlegger. Paddy mostly sold "candy bars" and was known on the beach for his cry of "cig-a-reets...nice ciga-reets for sale." He was also a member of ACTRA and actively raised money for the beach. Watermelon has also worked both as a comic and comedy show host. She co-produced The Pink Show with Christine Taylor and a vaudeville-style variety evening called Electric Caesar Salad, which was later called The Grow Show. Her comedy nights have attracted and hosted such international comedy stars such as Zach Galifianakis and Sarah Silverman, Watermelon herself has opened for comedians such as Tig Notaro, Scott Thompson and Janeane Garofalo. Plans include continuing the Watermelon brand through her marijuana cooking show. She is also working on a cookbook, and has begun work on a memoir. And of course, she's looking at eventually running the city in a more official capacity.

"I plan to run for Mayor of Vancouver in 2023," she says.

She will officially retire from Wreck on Sept 8, 2015, on what she likes to call her "Arrest-aversary" (she was arrested on the beach on Sept. 8 2001). Until then, she says she is happy to continue to serve watermelon-hungry Wreck Beachers.
